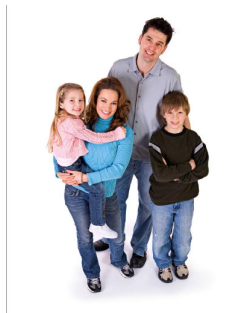
Dear Alice,
